1. Literacy Requirement	3	1 point for a yes answer <i>if</i> there is documentation, a description or an explanation. Plus 0.5 points if there is minimal support for the yes answer, 1 to 1.5 points for minimal to up to sufficient support, 2 points for sufficient support or better	
2. Lessons	4	.5 to 1 point for each 25% of total grades in a school that have at least one lesson. Give .5 points if only one subject is covered, 1 point if two or more subjects are covered. Round up on the percentages.	
3. Assessments	4	1 point for each 25% of total grades in a school that have at least one assessed lesson or curriculum. Round up on the percentages.	
4. STEM	4	.5 to 1 point for each 25% of total grades in a school that have at least one lesson. Give .5 points if only one STEM standard is covered, 1 point if two or more standards are covered. Round up on the percentages.	
5. Green Tech/Careers	4	1 point for each 25% of total grades in a school that have at least one assessed lesson or curriculum. Round up on the percentages.	
6. A.P. Environmental Science	4	1 point for yes, if documentation included, 1 point for percentage that participated, and 1 point if 25% of those scored 3 or above.	
7. Certification	4	1 point for each individual teacher certified in some environmental/sustainability/outdoor/nature/gardening program.	
8. Workshops Attended	4	.5 points for each individual teacher who has attended some environmental/sustainability/outdoor/nature/gardening program.	
9. Workshops Provided	4	1 point for each individual teacher who has provided a workshop sharing an environmental/sustainability/outdoor/nature/gardening lesson or program.	
10. Outdoor Learning	4	.5 to 1 point for each 25% of total grades in a school that have at least outdoor experience. Give .5 points if only one subject is covered, 1 point if two or more subjects are covered. Round up on the percentages.	
11. Context & Community	4	2 points for an outdoor experience that provided a context for at least two subject standards, 1 point for each standard. 2 points for an outdoor experience that engaged the broader community (1point) and developed civic skills (1).	
12. Community Engagement	4	4 points for at least one project – 1 point for project description, 1 point for how community was engaged, 1 point for the environmental/sustainability component, 1 point for a description of outcomes (not just outputs)	
13. Partnerships	4	2 points for each partnership. 1 point for scope and 1 point for impact.	
14. Education Summary	6	Up to two points for each of the three practices highlighted. First point is for a minimal description. 2 nd point is for level of detail, how innovative the initiative the practice is and/or the barriers of place, circumstance or culture that the practice overcomes.	
15. Media	4	1 point for each photo and description or for each minute of video.
